What is Cub Scouting? Pack 73 B.S.A.

Cub Scouting with Pack 73 emphasizes development of personal qualities: character building, outdoor skills, citizenship, fitness, athletics, science, nature, hands-on practical skills, and many others. Cub scouting helps younger boys anticipate and prepare for the even more exciting world of Boy Scouts. Cub Scouting with Pack 73 offers a wonderful framework of activities (both scout and family) for you to get closely involved with your son. Many boys (and parents) especially value their den friendships. We guarantee that long after your young scout has grown up you will both fondly remember your scouting adventure.

The Purposes of Cub Scouting

Since 1930, the Boy Scouts of America has helped younger boys through Cub Scouting. It is a year-round family program designed for boys who are in the first through fifth grade. Parents, leaders, and organizations work together to achieve the purpose of Cub Scouting.

Baden Powell the creator of the scouting movement in 1907 described scouting as “A game with a purpose”.

Sportsmanship and Fitness, Family Understanding, Respectful Relationships

Pack 73 in a nutshell

Meetings: Pack - generally 7PM 2nd Wednesdays Monthly; Den - 2-3/month by den schedule
Pack 73 and Cub Scouting is sports schedule friendly.

Where: Pack meetings are usually at Bancroft or Doherty schools. Dens at members locations,

Dues: \$65 / Scout, with some pay as you go activities

Uniform: Scouts are expected to wear at least a Cub Scout shirt with appropriate council insignia.



Pack 73 Cub Scouts (grades 1-5) generally meet all together as a Pack monthly at 7:00 PM on second Wednesdays at Bancroft or other available venues. Individual dens (by grade) meet 2-3 times monthly. Many families are comfortable bringing other siblings to our pack meetings. We understand that your scouts are likely to also be interested in sports, our meetings and activities usually do not conflict with sports events. We believe your scout and family will benefit from your participation in scouting but attendance at every event is of course not mandatory.

The Pack 73 year consists of combinations of pack and den activities. Here is a sample of recent activities:

- Pack meeting activities: Citizenship, engineering fun, Mousetrap cars, Space Derby, swimming, woodworking projects
- Pinewood Derby - scouts build wooden cars from standard kits to race.
- Day trips: Spinners games, Summer scout camp (overnight and day), Freedom trail, USS Constitution, Hikes
- Scouting for Food - collection of canned goods for local food pantries
- Overnight sleepovers at the Ecotarium, Higgins Armory, Museum of Transportation, Battleship Cove, YMCA., family camping
